- 1. REASON FOR INVESTIGATION: Investigation is being conducted in compliance with communication from Headquarters 66th CIC Detachment, Subject and file as above, dated 30 Nov 50. The US Immigration and Naturalization Service is considering an investigation of SUBJECT for possible revocation of his citizenship. Helen OUKAS, who may have been SUBJECT's secretary prior to 1933, and who was reportedly brought to the US by SUBJECT, was reported to be in contact with Communists and suspected Soviet agents.
- 2. SYTOISIS OF PREVIOUS INVESTIGATION: An FBI memorandum dated 23 Oct 50 mentions a Helen DUKAS, born 17 Oct 1896 at FREIBURG, Germany (French Zone) as having immigrated into the US from Bermuda in 1935. She reportedly was brought to the US by SUBJECT, and was later employed by him as secretary and housekeeper. DUKAS was reported to have corresponded during the early 1940's with Soviet agent Otto/PATZ, and to have been acquainted with Ars Tetty MADVANYT, a refugee German Communist.
- 3. PRESENT INVESTIGATION: SUBJECT became director of the Kaiser-wilhelm Institute for Physics in 1914. Coming from ZUTRICH, he registered at BERLIN-Dablem, Phrenbergstr 33. In 1915 he moved to BERLIN-Lichtenrade, wittelsbacherstr 13. From 1919 until 1933 SUBJECT lived at BERLIN-Schoeneberg, Maberlandstr 5, fourth (German) floor. This street has been renumbered twice in the meantime. Both houses having had the number 5 were destroyed. One former renter of this building, (fmu) TETZLAFF, BERLIN & 30, Bambergerstr 26, US Sector, stated that SUBJECT was on good terms with a family named AUFRBACH. Lotte SCHINFER, nee AUERBACH, now resides at 26 Ashford Court, LONDON IN 2. A former housekeeper of the AUERBACH family, Marie KULAONSKI, about 70 years old, knows FINSTEIN quite well and is still receiving food packages from ETNSTEIN. FULLYONSKI is allegedly living either in HOF (MSI/O.99) or in the neighborhood of NOF. TETZLAFF stated that SUBJECT did not have an office in or outside of his apartment. The only offices he maintained, according to this source, were in the Kaiser-Wilhelm Institute for Physics and at the University of BERLIN.
- 4. Available files show only one Helene DUEAS, wine dealer at BERLIN & 8, withelmstr 47 in 1929. This address is now located in the Soviet Sector of BERLIN.
 - 5. UNDEVELOFED LEADS AND FUTURE ACTION:
- a. A search is being made for former associates of SUBJECT and for former communist intellectuals who may have moved in SUBJECT's circle of acquaintances.
- b. Attempts will be made to initiate discreet inquiries in the Soviet Sector regarding Holene DUKAS.
- c. Efforts are being made to obtain more information regarding Lotte follows and harie FLYCO SKT.

- Reference is made to letter, your Office, deted 2 October 1952. Subject as above, file G2, STS.
- 2. Frevious investigation of SUBJECT, with perticular stress on Helene DUXAS, failed to disclose any specific leads for further investig tion.
- 3. The results of the investigation are contained in the inclosed reports which are forwarded for your information.
- 4. In addition, investigation of Holons FUEZS in FUEZBURG merely disclosed that she was born there and that her parents were named Leopold DUMAS and Hannchen, born IMEB'VIN. They previously resided in FULLBURG. Rheinstrasse ?. Their present whereabouts and that of Helene FUKAS could not be ascertained.
- 5. The one possible lead which might be considered capable of further exploitation concerned Marie KULFOSKA. Since Marie KULKOSKA is considered to stend in close contact with "UPJEC", no ettempt was made to interview her because of the possibility of compromise of the investigation of SUBJECT. If your Office desires, this interview will be conducted.

REASON FOR INVESTIGATION: Investigation is being conducted in compliance with request from Headquarters, 66th CIG Detachment, to determine the identity of SUBJECT's pre-1933 secretary, and to determine the validity of allegations to the effect that SUBJECT and his secretary had been connected with a pre-1933 communist underground movement.

2. SYNOPSIC OF PREVIOUS INVESTIGATION:

- a. Reference is made to AR, Region X, subject as above, file X-714, dated 13 March 1950. SUBJECT's pre-1933 secretary, watchmaker's shop known as UHRENELB BAHLIN, and a Kertonagen-fabrik operated by Walter SCHAUERHAUSEN, BERLIN, used as telegram address for Comintern and Soviet apparate.
- b. Reference is made to AR, Region VIII, Subject and file numbers as above, dated 14 February 1951. SUBJECT, prior to 1933, had been on good terms with a family named AURBACH. Lotte SCHIFFER, nee AURBACH, now resides at 26 Ashford Court, 10 NDON NW 2. A former housekeeper of the AURBACH family, Marie KULKOWSKI, knows SUBJECT quite well, still receives food packages from him, and is alleged to live in or near HOF (M51/099).
- 3. PRESENT INVESTIGATION: Efforts were made to obtain further information on Lotte SCHIFFER, nee AURHBACH, formerly residing in BERLIN-Schoeneberg, Haberlandetr 5, now residing in LONDON, England.

KRUEGER preised the character of these two women but could not give any further information. During en interview on 25 February Frau THTMLAFF stated in substance as follows: Marie AUERBACH and her daughter Lotte moved into the neighborhood in 1912, Frau AUERBACH being divorced at this time. The maid of the AUERBACH femily was Maria KULKOSKA. At this time the family was fairly wealthy but from 1912 to 1933, lost most of their possessions. In 1933 the AUERBACH's moved to aschaffenburgerstr 9 where Frau AUERBACH opened a rooming house, which she operated until 1939. During this time Lotte AURR-BACH married a fnu SCHIFFER, who resided in the vicinity of Prager latz. Later Lotte immigrated to England with her husband. In 1933 Frau AULRBACH moved with her maid KULKOSKA to Landshuterstrasse 13, where the maid opened a rooming house. In 1940 Freu AUERBACH moved to Nymphenburgerstr (exact address not known). In 1941 Frau AUSRBACH was arrested by the Gestapo and has not been heard of since. Frau TITALAFF received the address of Lotte SCHIFFER from Frau KULKOSKA in 1945 and wrote her a letter but to date has received no answer. The address of Lotte SCHIFFER in 1945 was: Lotte SCHIFFER, LONDON WW2, Ashford Jourt 26, LONDON, England. During this interview Frau TETZLAFF olsimed that the AUERBACH family were close friends of the Prof Albert BINGTAIN family and BINGTEIN's daughter and Lotte SCHIFFER grew up together until the EINSTRIN family moved to the United States. In German politics of the time, EINSTEIN's, Frau AUERBACH and Lotte SCHIFFER were anti-Nazis because of the persecution of the Hews. Though TETALAFF did not know to which political parties the two families belonged, she claimed that Frau Marie AUskBall was not pro-socialist and that both Lotte THIFF and Frof EINSTEIN were left wing socialists and proemunist. Whether they were members of the then existing Communist Farty was not known. (F-3)

4. A check on Marie KULKOWEKI, age 70, former maid of at ABACH family, yielded the following results:

a. The correct name of the former AU. 3. Jh maid is Maria KULKOSKA. (F-2)

c. See paragraph 3d above for the residence of MUL-KOSKA from 1912 to 1941. TETZLAFF stated that she was visited by KULKOSKA in 1945, at which time KULKOSKA claimed she was residing in HOF with her sister, exact address not known.

- d. An interview with Frou Brika LINKE, born 7 Johnsty 1905, Noordlingerstr 1, was conducted on 2% Sebruary 1951. Frau LINES stated in substance as follows: Marie Culkuska moved to Landshuterstr 13 in 1939, but this address was bombed out in 1944. KULKOSKA then evacuated BERLIN and moved to her sister and nephew in KOLBERG (055/ML4). When KOLBERG was occupied by the Soviet Army, KULKOSKA moved to HOF, where she is presently residing. The exact address was not known by Frau LINKE.
- e. Both Frau LINKE and Frau TETLLAFF claim that KULKOSKA was a mamber of the Social Democratic perty. They also claim that KULKOSKA has been receiving financial support from Prof. EINSTEIN since 1945. (F-2)
- 5. A check of the watchmaker shop "UHRANALB", BELLIN, was conducted, with the following results:



The Bureau extended the deadline to ninety days due to the length of the correlation summary.

The Bureau has no objection to this proposed procedure. However, it is pointed out that Bureau files do not contain any information reflecting the reason why Newark reopened the investigation on February 4, 1953. Therefore, if Newark is in possession of pertinent information which should be made available to the Bureau before ninety days, an interim report should be submitted.

Instant investigation was re-opened on 2/4/53 in view of the fact the name of ALBERT EINSTERN appeared as a signature on a letter dated 12/23/52 received by Judge IRVING R. KAUFMAN, which letter was furnished to the New York Office by Judge KAUFMAN. This letter appealed for commutation of the sentences of JULIUS and ETHEL ROSENBERG. In part this letter stated that EINSTEIN felt compelled by conscience to make the appeal and that no one would ever learn from him that he had written such a letter. Furthermore, that he did not wish to challenge the Jury's verdict as such although he did want to mention that for anyone who was not present in court during the trial, the guilt of the defendants was not established beyond a reasonable doubt.

Dear Sir:

Readers Digest for May carries a story about Dr. Albert Einstein being a sweet simple harmless old genius who had been duped by radicals into permitting the use of his name as being a supporter.

But this gentle old darling, so innocent and naive, was introduced to me as the brain that was setting up Hollywood in the Thirties for the big Communist push.

I had been story and advertising executive with David Wark Griffith pictures from 1919 into early thirties. Wearly all our laboratory men were bolsheviks, our head man having been summoned back to Russia to take charge of films there.

One of our second cameramen was Abe Schultz, an open communist who went back and forth to Russia.

In early Thirties, I was executive head of story department at RKO studio. Among writers under me was John Howard awson etc.

One day Tycko phoned asking me to call on him at Ambassador Hotel, the matter being most urgent.

thought he was nuts for was getting \$30,000 a year and going up every six months. After talking too long, he finally said: "Well, I can see that Dr. Einstein has got to take you in hand. He s the one that never fails with the big shots."

I wanted to know which Einstein, and he said THE Dr. Pinstein of the theory. I thought he was joking, but he said come along. We went upstairs in the Ambassador and he knocked at a suite door, and Einstein answered. He said he was busy, but would see me next day. I got a glimpse into his rooms and I thought the man I saw there was Charlie Chaplin.

Going downstairs, Tycko told me that Einstein was organizing all the big studio figures, Schulberg at aramount, stars like reddie March, "alter Juston, Hepburn etc, and all the leasing directors and writers. e said: "e ve got them in our hand, and the Dr. has never failed on one; give him an hand."

f course bolshevism then implied touch prestige as Communism does today. was busy and ignored Tycko. The phoned 38 APR 24 1953 and # evaded, but several days later he was at the studio when

₹ 1 got through for the day, asking me to take a ride.

Then he calmly wanned me that if I wanted to get ahead in Hollywood I had better play ball with him, that through Einstein they were getting control of every studio, and that if I didn't be sensible I might be through in Hollywood.

At the time I had two offers from other studios in my pocket, and I said: Tycko, you are becoming a crackpot; you've got defusions about this bolshevik thing, and are really going haywire. "

But he said soberly: "Alright, I'm warning you as a friend; I don't like to see you get hurt and you would be valuable. If you change your mind, phone me."

Within three weeks # was staggered to hear the writers had asked that # be discharged, that they couldn't get along with me.

Later I had four contracts laker cancelled after they had been signed, and I never wax was able to stay in a Hollywood studio more than a few weeks.

Then a few years ago 1 found out what John Howard Lawson was.

of course I know nothing about Einstein now, but he was no gentle old dupe then, and the top outfit in Hol'ywood was certainly not organized by the Russian photographers and film laboratory men.

All this can be verified for Tycko must have had a lease at the Ambassador notel and Einstein's name must be on the register.

I know this has no value now, nor can it be proved, but it is a pernicious thing that magazines should present Einstein as a sweet blundering old darling who is so easily misled by the naughty radicals. ertainly at that time he was one of the most dangerous and powerful figures in what has become the Communist movement; for Tycko was in deadly earnest when he talked with me.

Reference is made to WFO memo dated June 16, 1953, requesting the Bureau to document Confidential Informant for the Newark Office.

Refmemo is not clear as to exactly which report pertains and as to what information is available in WFO reports. Paragraph 2 of refmemo states that a particular report does not appear in a WFO file. Paragraph 3 of refmemo states that the same report appears in another WFO file. Therefore, if NFO has two files on the subject "Dr. Frank Porter Graham," the files should be reviewed in order to determine that all reports are appropriately filed in the proper file.

The Bureau file in the case entitled "Frank Porter Graham, National War Labor Board, Internal Security - Hatch Act," contains a report by SA dated August 10, 1943, at Washington, D. C., WFO file 101-2644. It is presumed that a documentation mentioned in this report is desired. The informant page of the report indicates that are, "Sources from which this information was obtained as set out in Bureau memorandum dated May 26, 1943, entitled, 'Frank Porter Graham, ' which contains summary material from a review of the Bureau's files."

Bureau memorandum dated May 26, 1943, on Frank MAILED 16 Porter Graham, a copy of which was furnished to WFO on June 3, 1943, does not reflect the source of the article appearing in the "New York Times" on Errch 19, 1940, which contains the information desired and which has been attri-buted to It appears that is a fictitious source made up by WFO for reportorial purposes in reporting the data in the August 10, 1943, report. In any event, this is public source material, and it would not appear that any documentation is necessary on desirable. It should be reported as information appearing in the "New York Times" on March 19, 1940, provided, of course, that the information does appear in the newspaper on that date.
